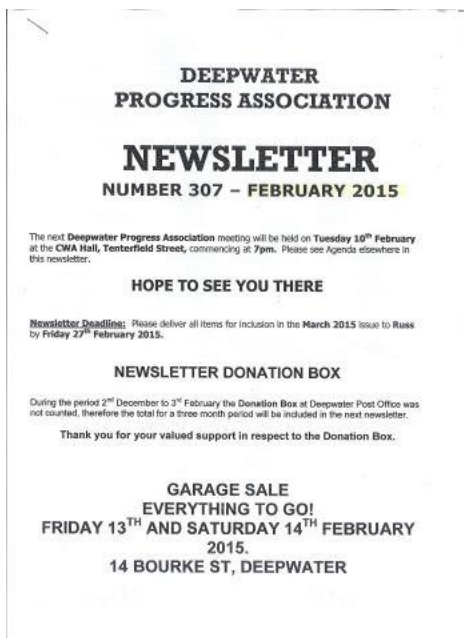

400th Newsletter

This is the 400th edition of the Progress newsletter – at least in its current count. There have been 11 editions each year, that’s more than 36 years! There have been a lot of changes to both the newsletter and the Association itself over that time, but one thing that hasn’t changed is the willingness of local people to come together and work to improve our town.

Of course the Association is much older than 36, and has been publishing news about our community for longer than that too. A June 1922 “Deepwater Doings” article in the Glen Innes Examiner describes a fancy dress football match to be played between a team of married men and a team of singles, all in costume, followed by a dance at the School of Arts hall. Also mentioned are the price of rabbit skins, the results of a 500 tournament, and the single line: “There was a shortage of butter in town on Saturday but supplies are to hand again.”

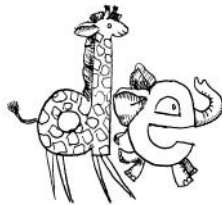
