Look up, look around!

Travel guides in cities will sometimes tell you to “look up” as you explore. Above the crowds, cafes and modern shop fronts you can see some amazing architecture. Depending on the city, some of the buildings can be 300-400 years old (or more).

Small Aussie towns like Deepwater obviously don't have the same types of buildings as cities in Europe or Asia, but if you slow down and “look around” there are still many interesting things to see – and stories to hear. Obvious ones include the Eclipse Theatre, railway station, and School of Arts hall. There are other places with less obvious stories.



The green-tiled building next to the town hall was once a general store, run for many years by Harry and Mary Theodore, and featuring high, pressed-metal ceilings. They still used mechanical adding machines well after electric cash registers

were available. If Harry was in a good mood, he'd get you fresher potatoes from “out the back”.

Before it was a bakery (then a cafe, then a bakery again) The Deepwater Bakery was a butchery. It was run by a man known only as “Shorty”. Shorty would give kids a free red saveloy sausage to chew on while he told their parents all about his latest fishing trip. The floor behind the counter was covered in sawdust.

Next time you're out and about in Deepwater, take some time to look around. There's a little piece of history around every corner, and every place has a story.

SOME MORE ANSWERS TO PREVIOUS ENQUIRIES

Once more, it is gratifying to see long sought after things starting to happen in the village. We have, in the past, asked



for Pedestrian crossings on the Highway near Foodworks and near the Diner.

We have now got signs to warn drivers that people may be trying to cross the road. They are within the vicinity of the areas The other big change is just as you come over the bridge into the village. A big red sign saying 50 painted on the road. We notice people slowing down now – and the Police also watching the area.



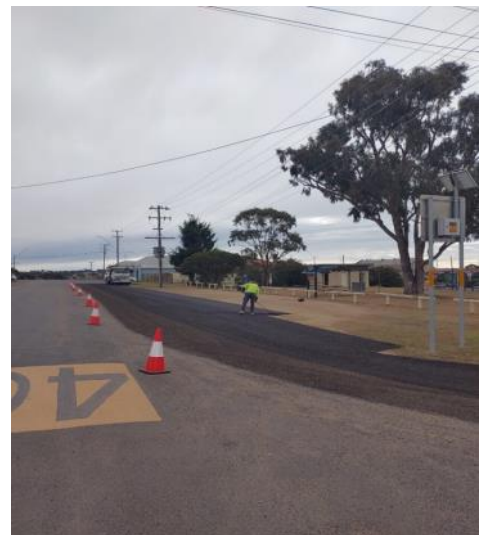
We are disappointed with the 100 southbound beginning just before the bridge, though.

How we are all rejoicing in the new sealed access to the Apex Park. Many travellers are already using the area with gratitude that the huge potholes have been fixed.

This is the history of the efforts to get this done. In October 2023 Joanne Green obtained over 200 signatures in a petition to Council for the potholes to be sealed. In November 2023 Progress Association wrote to Adam Marshall for help in lobbying for this. Adam responded in November and again in January 2024

after he received a reply from Council. Now in June 2024 we know that a concerned resident spoke to the right person at the right time to get the workers who were in the village working in front of the Deepwater Inn (Longhorn) and they kindly extended the work to in front of Apex Park.

It takes a lot of people working together to get to a very satisfying place.

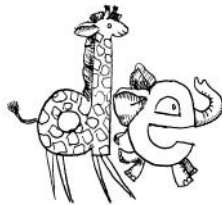
